We begin the month by celebrating Catholic Education Week from May 5th to 9th, guided by this year's theme, "Pilgrims of Hope." May's Virtue of the Month is Responsibility, and our focus this month will be to actively care for the good of others and God's creation, to fulfill our commitments even when it becomes difficult to do so, and to be accountable for the things we say and do. It's sure to be an eventful and exciting week at Holy Name, and we are looking forward to all the wonderful learning and activities that will be taking place.

Catholic Education Week: This week, we celebrate Catholic Education Week. Holy Name CES will be celebrating Catholic Education Week with a variety of activities focusing on the theme, "Pilgrims of Hope." This year we will be taking an outdoor aerial photo on Monday, May 5th at 9:30 (weather permitting), students and staff together will create a 'cross of hope' on the field. Proud to be a Huskie: Last week, we launched a renewed effort to support our school's dress code in a positive and constructive way. Making Tracks Scootering Program: Get Ready to Scoot around Holy Name!!! This week, the grades 1-3 students will be participating in the "Making Tracks Scootering" Program. Making Tracks is designed to educate and train children in the skills needed to safely use active transportation in the community and to promote the importance of being physically active, particularly going to and from school. We ask that you please ensure your child brings in either a bicycle or hockey helmet labelled with their name for the duration of the program.
