As we enter the final two weeks of the 2024-2025 school year, we are reminded of all the wonderful things that we as a school community have accomplished together. Here's a look at what's happening this week.

**Grade 1 Outdoor Learning Workshop:** On Monday, June 16th, our grade one students will be participating in Lake Simcoe's Regional Conservation's Outdoor Education Program here at Holy Name. Students will learn about and experience the natural world and strengthen their connection with the environment around them. The program will run rain or shine, therefore please ensure students are dressed appropriately for the weather.

In addition, there are designated areas (with marked fences) set out for parents and spectators. Bleachers are reserved for athletes and coaches/and supervisors. We understand that students wish to cheer on their peers at these events; however, please be mindful that this is a regular school day for students who are not on the team. Any students who attend these events as spectators **must be directly supervised by their parent/guardian**. All student-athletes must ride the bus back to Holy Name; parents are not permitted to sign out their children from the event. If parents wish, they can sign out their children once students return to school. Please ensure that your child has extra water, a hat, and sunscreen for the day. **School Bus Reminder:** As we continue to prioritize student safety in every part of the school day, we'd like to remind everyone about the importance of proper behaviour on the school bus. Student safety while on the bus is essential, and following bus rules helps keep everyone safe. We kindly ask that students are reminded to **remain seated** at all times while the bus is moving, **keep noise levels low** so the driver can concentrate, and **listen to and follow the driver's instructions** at all times.
